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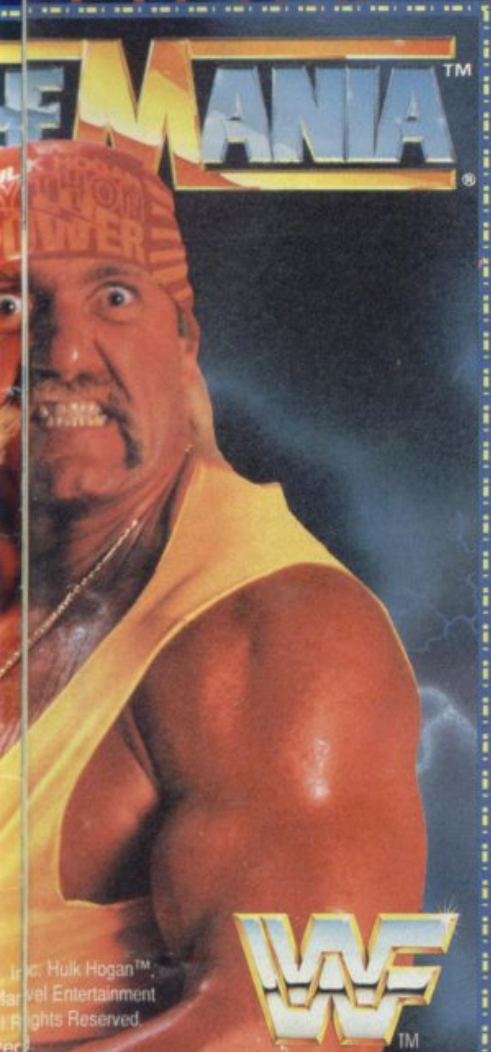
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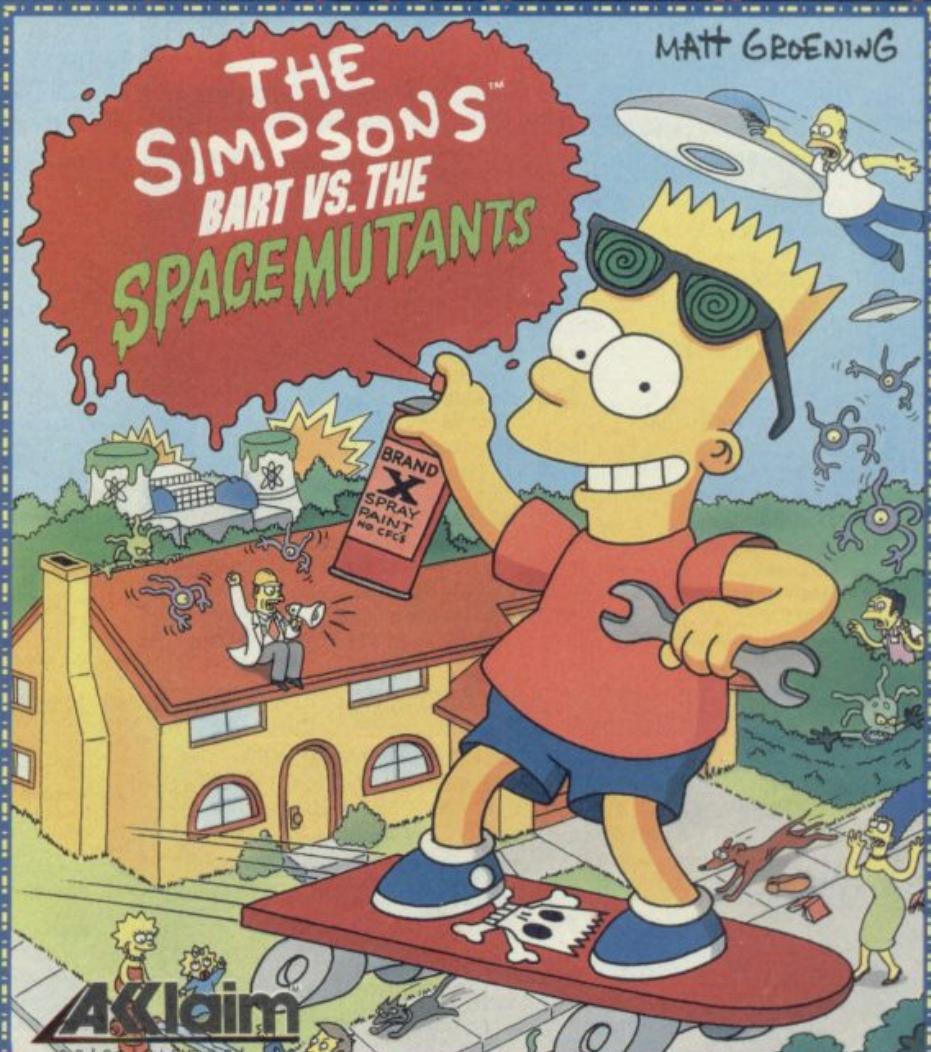

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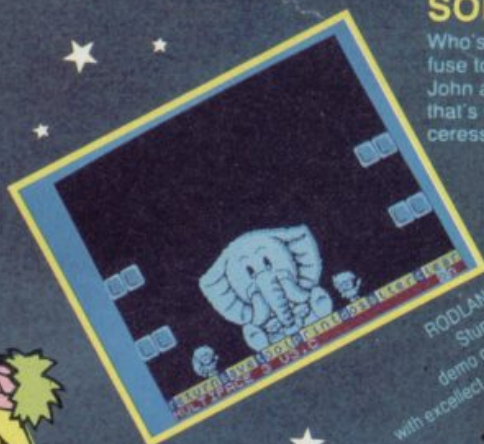

LEMMINGS - Playable Demo Memory 48/128K

If any problems occur while playing Lemmings on older machines reload using 48K basic mode and Load "L".

Lemmings are cute little creatures, which in this demo, are under your control. The task in hand is to guide your lemmings from a trapdoor, from which they first appear, to an exit located somewhere on the level. Their shambling journey is littered with hazards like chasms, pits and barriers which the loopy lemmings have to overcome or avoid by tunnelling, building bridges and generally behaving like a manic, rodent construction company.

There are a number of icons along the bottom of the screen which makes the lemmings you are pointing at perform a certain action. It could be to climb a wall, dig a tunnel, blow something up etc. If you hate the sight of these creatures, you can always nuke them and watch as they explode.

Whilst guiding your clan through the vast unknown, you should realise that a certain number need to get through that escape gate. If the right quota of rodents don't get through, then it's back to the start.

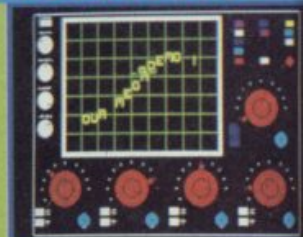

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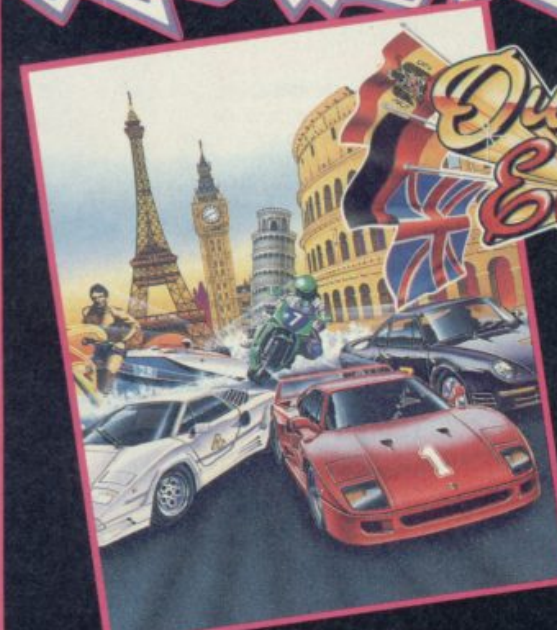

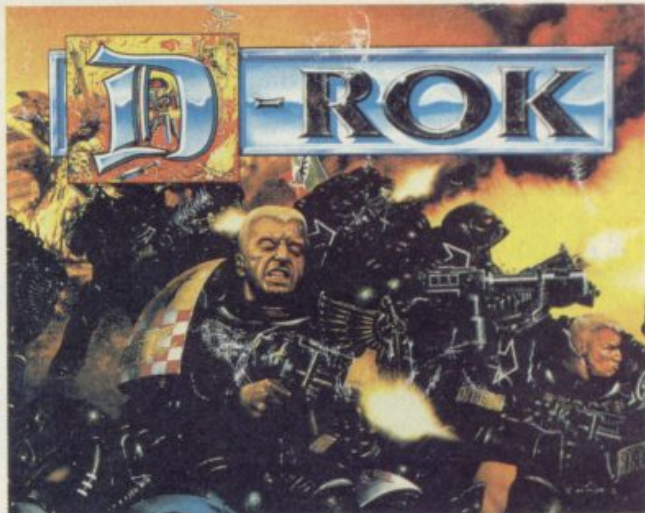

SU CREW OUT OF THIS WORLD

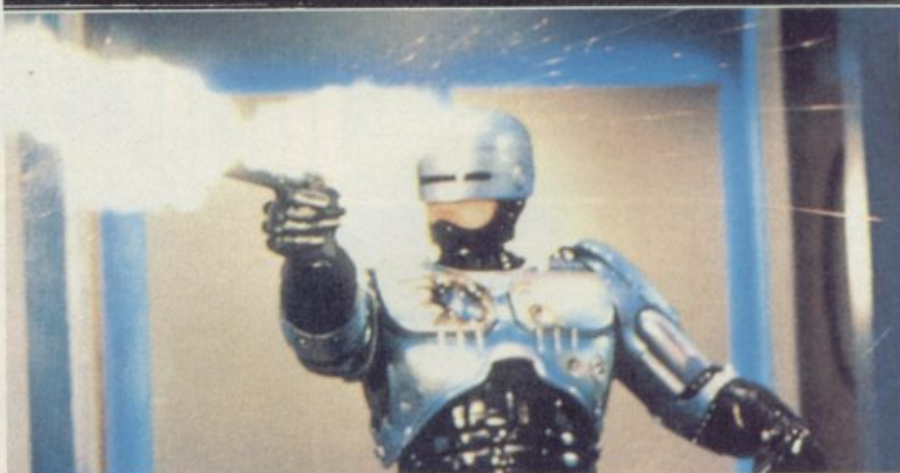

Level Four:

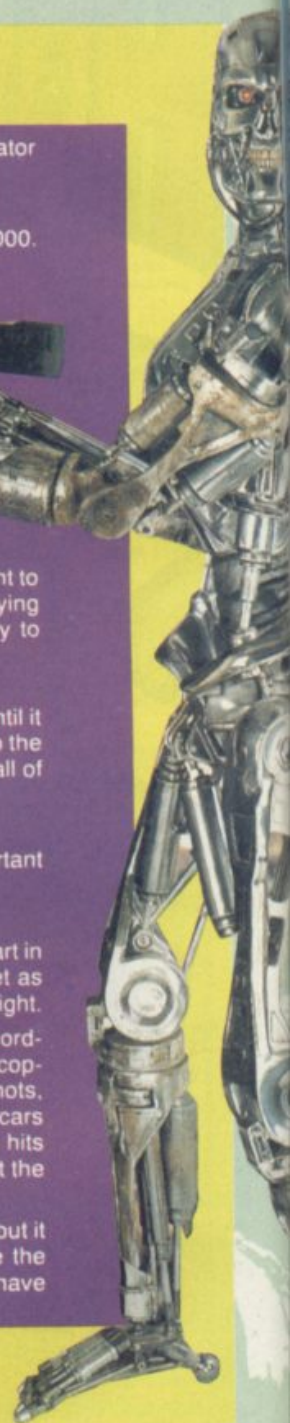
The same as level one, but it is important to get the first hit in.

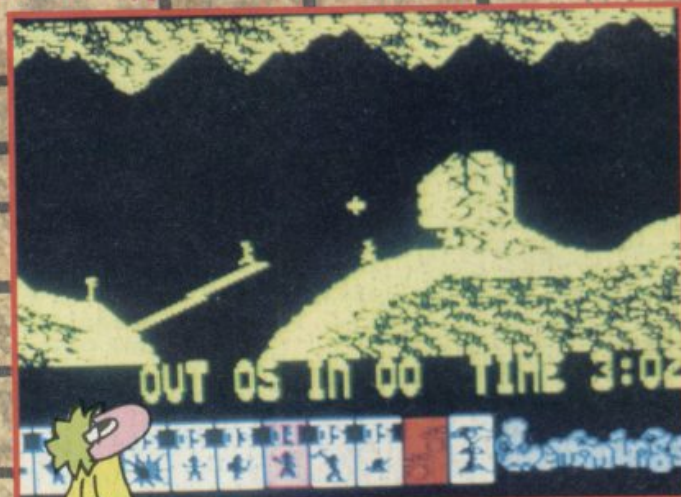
Eeeek! They're horrible, they're vile and they're savagely suicidal! It's the Lemmings and it's your

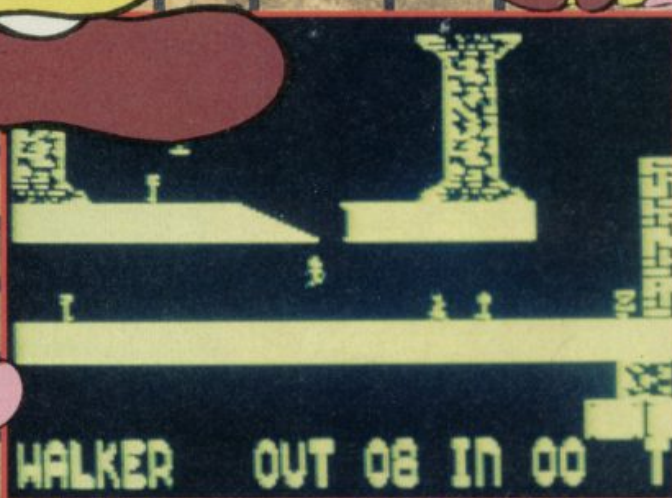

Gordon is also in the market for buying second hand Spectrum adventures, and boasts that nothing will be refused. This means that he'll probably give you about tuppence for some game that nobody but you has ever heard of, but you will get a fair price for a fair game. Just like those second-hand record shops who use the same slogan ("nothing refused"), the price that you will get depends very much on the quality of the material on offer.

As a final service, if you are desperately trying to get hold of a particular adventure, you can also write to GI Games and see if they have it in stock. You will receive a list of everything that is currently on offer, which by now probably runs to about three million games, so if you ARE determined

to update your collection by acquiring a special game then GI Games are well worth a stamp. You've got a better chance of finding it there than by walking into the nearest Boots or W.H.
