

BRIEFLY..


Enclosed is a small but useful utility for the QL. The main procedure called WIND will give your window a shadow behind it. This will give your windows a better appearance. It works by windowing the window at x+a,y+a, then clearing it black and then rewindowing the window at x,y. By changing the value of a you can make some windows appear higher or lower. The syntax for the WIND command is WIND (chan,width,high,x,y,paper colour,a). Note you must first open the screen chan if it is not already open. The procedure win1 will change the positions of and give #0, #1 and #2 shadows. #1 will appear to be the lowest (a=4) with #2 being in the middle (a=5) and #0 the highest (a=6). To use enter "win1". Both these procedures work in MODES 4 and 8.

OVERHEATING SPECTRUM?

If you are having problems with your Spectrum overheating the following may be of assistance. The Spectrum's heat sink on examination, after removing the upper portion of the case, is revealed as very small and it becomes very hot after a period of constant usage. The heat-sink is used to dissipate energy from the power supply that is a voltage higher than is required by the computer. The area of the heat sink may be easily increased by bolting a thin strip of aluminium sheet approximately 12mm wide by 159mm long onto the present heat sink and running it along the front of the case.



Details of extra heat sink modification.

This will result in the computer running at a lower temperature. CARE MUST BE TAKEN TO ENSURE THAT NONE OF THE ELECTRICAL COMPONENTS AND IN PARTICULAR THE ROW OF DECOUPLING CAPACITORS CONNECTED ALONG THE ROW OF 4116 MEMORY CHIPS ARE NOT SHORT CIRCUITED.



A COMPLETE PERSONAL COMPUTING SYSTEM.

This is not a joking matter! we're serious and should be to. It has been more than three years since Sir Clive has released a machine into the computer market, the following reviews and facts have been put together to assure you that this is by no means a fantasy computer, but is really on its way. I.E. has been negotiating with Cambridge Computers for the last 3 months to get 100 of the Z88 into the country. Unfortunately they are 3 months late in the production of the computer and that is the reason why we have not received ours yet. Apart from that the reports received on the computer are getting better and better by the day!

The Z88 is a real achievement for Sir Clive, and to top it all he certainly has lost none of his skill or entrepreneurial genius. He has, just as he said he would, released the first truly portable computer that anyone could carry and use constructively. Yet again, Sir Clive has ignored what most people consider to be the industry standard, MS-DOS, by producing a machine which at best can be described as idiosyncratic.

NOW, read on!

Having paid your money (more than likely a couple of months prior to the machine arriving on your doorstep) it is somewhat disappointing to receive nothing more than a small briefcase-like package, but once you have extricated the machine, the disappointment soon turns to amazement!

Compact

The compactness of the Z88 is truly a revelation. With a surface area slightly larger than an A4 pad, and weighing less than a hard cover book, the Z88 really is the epitome of portability, and even when it is stored in its case - advisable if you want the machine to last - it will comfortably fit in all but the briefest briefcase!

Most people believed that Sir Clive would stick with microdrives, as used in the QL. But the big surprise is that the Z88 takes a different approach - RAM and EPROM. At the front of the Z88 are three expansion slots that can take an assortment of RAM and EPROM cartridges. The advantage of this is that the RAM is both simple and



reliable. If it becomes necessary to store more important information more permanently, that is where the EPROM comes in. Using the built in EPROM blower, the Z88 can copy files and information from the RAM cartridges straight to EPROM.

The following questions were recently asked to Sir Clive and he had the following answers.

Q. THE MACHINE USES EPROM CARTRIDGES FOR MASS STORAGE. WITH CONVENTIONAL DISKS ONE ADVANTAGE YOU HAVE IS THAT YOU CAN CARRY OUT A SELECTIVE RANDOM ACCESS PURGE TO CLEAR OUT YOUR UNWANTED FILES. WITH THE Z88 CARTRIDGE YOU CAN ONLY ERASE THE WHOLE CONTENT AT ONE.

A. "Yes, but that's not a problem because you use it in a different way. You take an EPROM with a lot of stuff on it, put it into the machine, dump the whole lot to RAM, delete the files you do not want, wipe the cartridge and save it all out again. The wipe process only takes about 12 seconds, which is pretty fast for EPROM. When you get up to a megabyte on a cartridge we are going to use PROMs which you can't erase yourself, though you can send them back to us to be wiped. (In South Africa's case the dealer). The reason is that we expect people to use the megabyte cartridge like a hard disk. It is essentially for long-term archival use. People don't generally delete things from their hard disks - they just dump things to them."

Q. WILL YOU LIMIT THE FUTURE CAPACITY OF THE CARTRIDGES TO 1MB? IF NOT, HOW WILL YOU MANAGE THE DIRECTORY PROBLEM?

A. "We don't need to limit the capacity. The current 1 MB cartridges have a 1 MB direct addressing range. There's no reason why you shouldn't have more than 1 MB in there, but as with a hard disk, you will have to tell the machine which page you want to look at."

Starting to sound more inviting? Read on.

Dead Flesh

The keyboard is made out of the familiar "dead flesh" rubber that was used on the early Spectrum computer. It feels lifeless to a first-time user. After a few hours use however, the keyboard grows on you, and it is found to be quite refreshing especially after many hours tapping away on your PC.

The screen is one of the most surprising features of the computer. Showing a total of eight lines (which is surprisingly ample) it is one of the new generation of "super-

twist" liquid crystal displays, in this case produced by the printer giant Epson.

WORD-PROCESSING

The software is very impressive. The main part of the software is a generic word processor-cum-spreadsheet-cum-database called Pipedream. The software is both well written and, so far, bug free. Pipedream is a spreadsheet that has been adapted to be a word processor. It allows the user to justify text, set line spacing, set headers and footers, as well as most features Wordstar users will have grown accustomed to.

If you can be satisfied with the word processing side of Pipedream, then the spreadsheet will come as a revelation. Using a similar format and entering system to such firm favourites as Lotus 1-2-3 and Visicalc, the almost immediate copying and loading from the Z88's RAM means that long and complex tables can be altered and maintained in minutes rather than hours.

Some interesting questions on compatibility were asked. Sir Clive answered:

Q. CAMBRIDGE COMPUTERS SELLS SOFTWARE TO TRANSFER FILES BETWEEN THE Z88 TO THE IBM PC. AT THE MOMENT, WORDSTAR AND LOTUS 1-2-3 ARE SUPPORTED. ARE THERE PLANS TO IMPLEMENT FILE TRANSFER TO OTHER SOFTWARE OR HARDWARE ENVIRONMENTS?

A. "Yes, a Macintosh package is under way, and as for others we'll look at them in the light of demand from our customers. Its worth remembering that there will be a healthy market for third-party manufacturers of add-on software and hardware for the Z88. a third-party communications pack for Z88 to BBC micro is one example which should appear shortly."

Achievement

Where Pipedream excels is for users who combine text and tables to form reports. Unlike programs such as Symphony, data can be changed and recalculated even when it is surrounded by text. Another useful feature for this kind of editing is the novel page map at the left of the screen, which gives the user an accurate picture of how the finished page will be printed. As well as Pipedream, the Z88 comes complete with a diary, clock, calendar, communications package, file import/export program, as well as an impressively complete version of BBC basic and a stand alone filing system. All these programs operate with the Z88's unusual menu system which uses the MENU key to pull on to the screen a variety of options. Another small thing that makes the computer even more remarkable in many peoples eyes is the fact that the computer is completely British made. (Some geeks believe that the Japs are the only ones that can make a good computer!). We hope that some of the points brought out in this article

will make you as positive about the Z88 as we are. as you would expect from Sinclair, the Z88's features set it apart from ALL other computers.



For the serious QL user who uses Assembly language on his computer, this program is an absolute must. The MACRO ASSEMBLER comes with a very extensive manual which is divided into three parts, describing in detail how to use each of the three programs which make the package:

- * MACRO ASSEMBLER
- * LINKER
- * SCREEN EDITOR

Each program's documentation is self-contained. The MACRO ASSEMBLER'S manual tells you:-

- * what inputs the assembler takes and what outputs it produces
- * how the assembler language instructions should be coded
- * what assembler directives are available, what they do, and how to code them

It is usually convenient to write programs as several separate source files and compile or assemble them at different times. It is then necessary to combine these compiled parts of program to form a single program file before the program can be run and the program which does this combining is called a LINKER. The LINKER'S manual tells you:-

- * What inputs the linker takes and what outputs it produces
- * details of the Sinclair relocatable binary file format

The SCREEN EDITOR may be used to create a new file or to alter an existing one. The text is displayed on the screen, and can be scrolled vertically or horizontally as required. The size of the program is about 20K bytes and it requires a minimum workspace of 8K bytes.



COMPUTER WARGAMING - AN INTRODUCTION

ORIGINS: The past decade has seen an enormous increase in the use of computer technology, with the use of home computers rising dramatically in the last five years.

The computer wargame, has developed from the table top wargame as a natural consequence of this technology. The computer is ideally suited to handle large amounts of rapidly changing data present during a large battle or campaign. Programmers have made full use of this to produce playable wargames which, over the years have increased in complexity and realism.

GAME TYPES: the first generation of games available represented attempts by the wargamer to portray tactical table top situations onto the screen. Whilst playable, these games tend to be slow to play, unrealistic and not user friendly. Some of these include "Invasion", "War 70" and the old favourite "Stonkers". These games are limited by the ingenuity of their programmers rather than by computer memory.

Recently produced games show a great improvement in quality, realism and ease of use. The trend has shifted toward reproducing the table top board wargames onto the computer.

The success of this can be seen in excellent campaign/strategy reproductions such as "Arnhem", "Desert Rats", "Vulcan", "Austerlitz" and "Johnny Reb". Limitations on games are no longer dependent on programmer ability but rather computer memory.

With the continuing increase in memory of the home computer the computer wargamer has a stimulating future.

ADVANTAGES:

1. **EASE OF SET UP:** set up time is less than 10 min on audio cassette.
2. **EASE OF PLAY:** the drudgery of dice throws, complex rules, movement etc, is handled by the computer.
3. **ONE PLAYER OPTION:** if other players are unavailable, the computer provides an opponent at anytime of day or night.
4. **STORAGE:** games can be stored on audio cassette (or disc) and can be easily "moved" to other venues for continued play. Table top games occupy the space of a large table and room.
5. **UMPIRE:** the computer is a fair, incorruptible, tireless umpire.
6. **GAME COSTS:** at R30 to R40 per game the computer game tends to be cheaper than its board game equivalent.

DISADVANTAGES:

1. **HARDWARE COSTS:** a TV set, a home computer (R300-R800) and a tape recorder (R50-R100) are needed to start.
2. **TV SCREEN AS BATTLEFIELD:** limitations on seeing the entire playing area at once, eyestrain, monopolising TV set. Loss of the tactile and three dimensional "feel" of the table top game and the feeling of "involvement" generated by dice throws, rule consulting and arguing with the umpire and other players.
3. **COMPUTER PHOBIA:** a genuine fear of computers is apparent in some people who feel disadvantaged as they are not familiar with computer technology.
4. **POWER SPIKES:** can destroy hours of play if not saved.

The computer wargame is here to stay and will increase in popularity. It will not however replace table top model wargaming. The above disadvantages plus the satisfaction derived by the model wargamer out of producing and painting quality models and scenery will ensure that. The long term effect of computer wargaming on table top board wargames may however be terminal.





REVIEW: QL STRIP POKER

Not too long ago Spectrum users got Samantha Fox Strip Poker. Now TALENT presents a girl called Denise to play against you.

STRIP POKER

The object of the game, uhm, is to help Denise to get rid of her clothes. This can be achieved by playing poker against Denise. Every time Denise has lost all her stake money, she will exchange an item of clothing for £200. The only disadvantage is that Denise plays poker rather well, which means, in all fairness, that every time you lose your stake money, you have to exchange some of your clothing for £200. This could lead to some embarrassing situation, for how would you explain to anyone, why you are 'working' in a semi-undress state at your computer.



The normal hands are recognised, e.g. STRAIGHT FLUSH, FOUR OF A KIND, FLUSH STRAIGHT (which, by the way is what you should be to enjoy the game), FULL HOUSE, THREE OF A KIND, TWO PAIRS, A PAIR.


After loading, the program asks whether you are using a colour or monochrome monitor. The graphics are then configured accordingly. When playing in monochrome, the full graphic capabilities of the QL are used.

Unfortunately there is no SOUND ON/OFF choice, which means that you will not be able to sneak to your computer in the middle of the night without anyone knowing. The sound effects can get a bit irritating.

This is one of these games which will keep most of us busy for hours. Although Denise certainly didn't have any cards up her sleeve (no sleeve, you see), I do think she cheats sometimes.

In this game for the 48K Spectrum, you shoot down 10 alien craft before they reach the safe zone. You are looking out of your cockpit window and have to line them up in your sights and fire your lasers. If they reach the safe zone then you have failed. The bottom of the screen displays time left and craft shot down.

Register HL holds the location where the copy starts. Register DE holds location where screen is moved to. Register BC holds the amount of bytes to be transferred. LDir carries out the task of moving the block of memory.

The next machine-code routine enhances the Spectrum's sounds. It uses the Spectrum's sound routine in the ROM. Register DE holds duration of the note; register HL holds pitch of the note; and register B controls the loop.

The final machine-code routine prints out the

explosion. The data for the explosion is held in location 40051 onwards. All the machine-code routines are held in Data statements within the program. So there is no need to load them separately in the Spectrum.

Once you have mastered the game as it stands, you can make it more difficult by reducing the time variable "ti" in line 300.





THIS SHORT program, written for either version of the ZX Spectrum, expands the idea of machine-code sound effects to produce a rhythm generator.

It is deliberately not too long or elaborate as this would mean losing some of the speed so essential to the program. The program itself suffers from the Spectrum's usual lack of

volume but even without headphones or amplification, some fairly impressive rhythms can be produced.

You have two instruments at your command; the bass drum and side-drum with snare. When the program is run, it asks you for first the length of the note of the bass drum, then the length of the note of the snare drum. It then asks you for the number of bars the rhythm is to be played and finally the rhythm the machine is to play each bar. This is fed into the computer as a string of letters, with B for a note on the bass drum and S for a note on the snare

drum. The other letter that can be input is P, for pause. Two or more can be written for longer pauses. Therefore BBSSPPSBBP would be read as two notes on the bass, then two on the snare, a short pause, another on the snare, two more on the bass and finally a very short pause.

Incidentally, if you are using headphones or amplification, the Mic socket gives a more faithful reproduction of the sound you hear from the Spectrum's own speaker but the Ear socket gives a sharper, louder, more percussive sound.

SOUNDSCANNER IN BETA BASIC: By GvW

Here is routine for those who enjoy staring at the screen as the Speccy performs yet another useless but spectacular trick ! In this routine a small code routine reads the sound level on the sound port and the program is so designed as to give a visual representation of it on the screen. Although it is written in Basic the routine is still fast enough to give a pretty good effect. For best results try playing a tape with female vocal music and play around with the volume. If you are getting a readout without playing any music\sound it means the Speccy is getting warm and is starting to pick up "noise" on the sound port. Increasing the value for S in line 20 will remove it but making it too high will distort the screen representation. Perhaps the enterprising would like to rewrite line 70 so that the program will run in Spectrum Basic.



SIGNAL BOOSTER

Correct cassette loading problems
by HAL SOHN

The signal booster consists of one miniature audio transformer. The transformer is used as an interface between the computer and the cassette player.


Examples:



The signal booster has the following advantages:

1. Isolates the computer from the cassette player, which eliminates noise.
2. Increases the audio signal amplitude.
3. Cassette player volume setting can be adjusted to a lower level, thus improving the signal/noise ratio, this lower level setting decreases the inherent noise caused by high level of volume setting of volume control of most cassette players.
4. Increased signal amplitude, allows for misalignment of the record/playback head, which causes low signal amplitude.
5. No power required.
6. LOW COST.

SCHEMATIC:



CONSTRUCTION

1. Drill two .250 (1/4 inch) holes in a plastic pill bottle, one through the cap, and the other through the bottle bottom.

2. Solder transformer leads to jacks (J1) and (J2) as per schematic, then insert into the plastic bottle.

NOTE: Don't use a metal container, the metal prevents proper isolation and grounding between the computer and the cassette player.

Parts List

1. T1 - 1K to 8 ohms (Radio Shack 273-1380)
2. J1 & J2 (Radio Shack 274-297)
3. Plastic pill bottle to fit transformer T1

When using signal booster, use a lower volume setting for best results.
